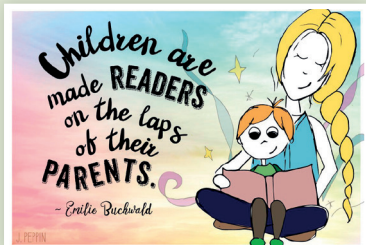
Family Time at Your Library

Everyone is starting to get into the Christmas mood, so why not indulge yourself and enjoy some family time reading together.

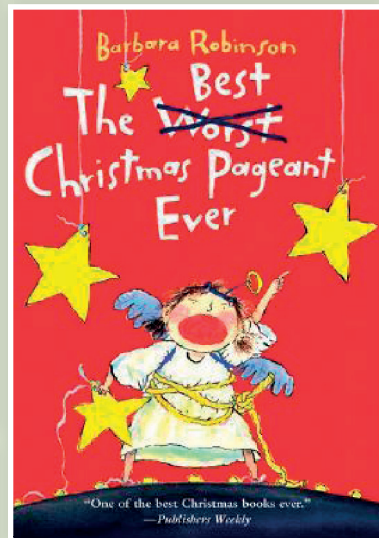
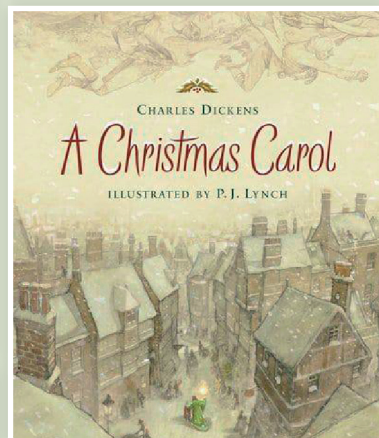
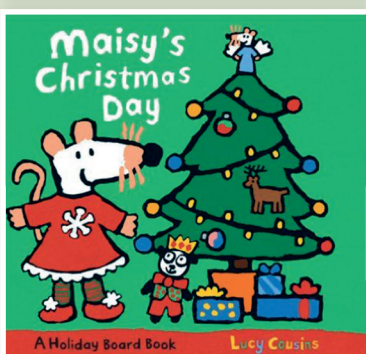
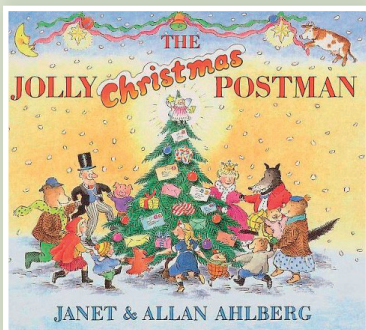
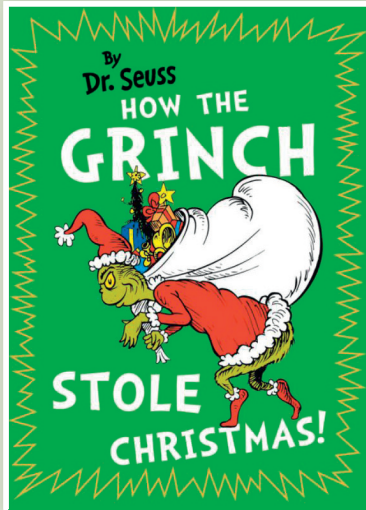

If you are busy, and find it hard to commit to a reading time, why not try our eAudiobooks?

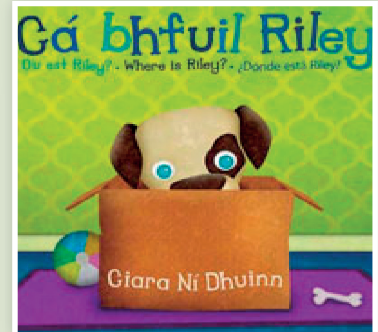
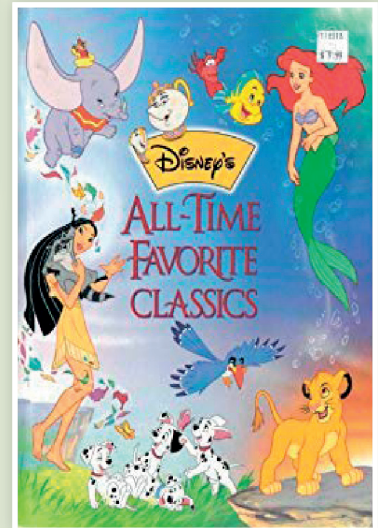


Download a story to your smartphone or tablet, and play while travelling! All library members can set up a free Borrowbox account, which gives

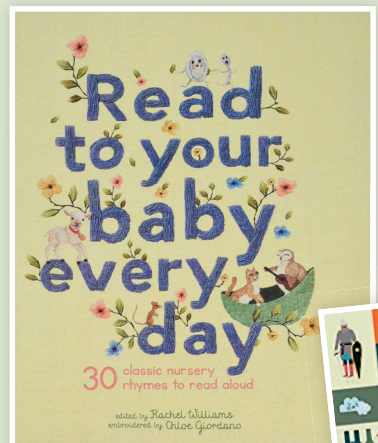
access to thousands of eBooks and eAudiobooks for all ages.

Make the most of family time by creating happy memories and habits which will last a lifetime. Reading provides a window into all sorts of experiences that will enrich our lives.

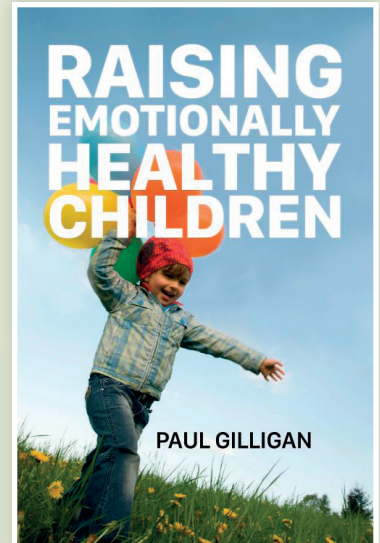

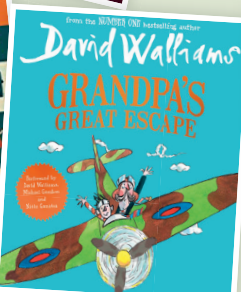
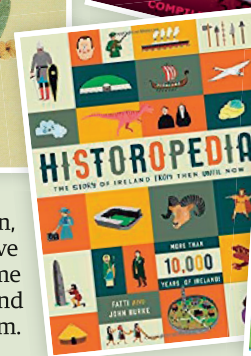
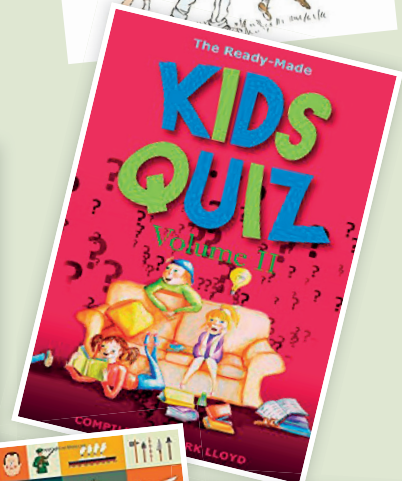
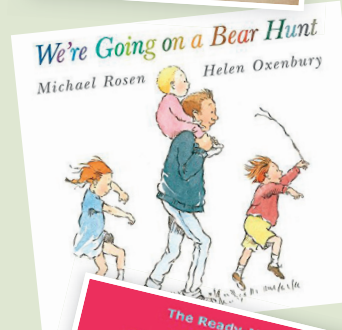
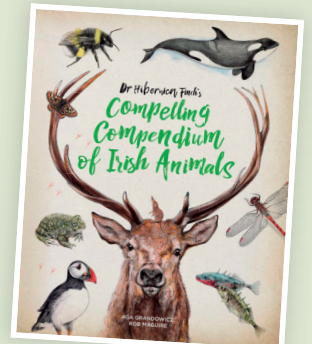


When we read to our children, we connect with them, we give them some of our precious time and make them feel loved and special. What a gift to give them.
