
A visit to Ferrybank Library

things to do.






I like to go to the children's area.

There are lots of books to choose from.






There is an underground car park at this library.

Or I can use the stairs.












A lot of people use my library.



Toy and Sensory Collection

These toys and sensory resources have been carefully selected to help with the development of your child's:

- Gross Motor Skills
- Fine Motor Skills
- Play and Life Skills
- Sensory and Tactile



We have two collections, one in Ferrybank Library and the other in Mayfair Library. You can request items through your local library.

Sensory Book stock

This book collection is a specialised autism collection for parents, children, teachers and carers. The books are available to Kilkenny Library members and you can request them from your local Kilkenny library branch. The collection has over 300 titles to choose from.

Reader Pens

Reader Pens read words and full lines of text aloud for independent reading. These digital highlighters can be helpful if you have dyslexia, difficulty with reading or pronunciation, are an English language learner or have vision problems. The Reader pen reads text out with a natural speaking voice. They have built-in dictionaries so you can access definitions as you read for better understanding. They can be borrowed, by any library member, for a three-week loan period.
