


## Finding Kilkenny in the **Virtual Record Treasury** of Ireland & The Statute of **Kilkenny Book Launch**



### n 25 November 2025, Kilkenny County Council Library Service will host the Virtual **Record Treasury Roadshow** from 6.45 to 9.00 p.m. in the Mayfair Library, Kilkenny.

Seven centuries of Irish history were lost when the Public Record Office was destroyed during the Battle of the Four Courts in 1922. In recent years historians and archivists have been searching for any copies that can help replace these lost records.

The Virtual Record Treasury of Ireland was launched in 2022, providing free online access to tens of thousands of replacement records, collected from around the globe.



Now, the Virtual Treasury team is coming to Kilkenny to share the results of their research. Young Voices Unearth Kilkenny's Hidden Histories

ver 100 primary school students took part in the "Fado, Fadó: Sparking Memories" competition last vear. The initiative is a collaboration between Kilkenny Archaeological Society, Kilkenny Library Service, and **Rothe House Trust.** 

Senior winner Beatrice Mealy (Presentation Convent, Castlecomer) traced her family's business, Fonsie Mealy Auctioneers. Junior winner Patrick Gallagher (Clara N.S.) documented "Tony's Cottage," a home filled with traditional tools and equipment. Standout entries included Katie Shortt's interview with her grandmother about Padmore & Barnes, Katie O'Sullivan's account of an ancestor's rabies treatment by Louis Pasteur, and Anna Usenko's family memories of WW2 in Ukraine. Winning entries are digitised on the Kilkenny Digital Archive.

The competition returns in 2025/2026 with new themes:

- Primary Schools (4th-6th Class) the theme is: Stories from the Lives of People in
- Second-Level Schools the theme is: The Past is My Place and we have two exciting cat-

Third Years: submit standout CBA history projects from last

Transition Years: A hands-on, fun research project that sparks curiosity.
